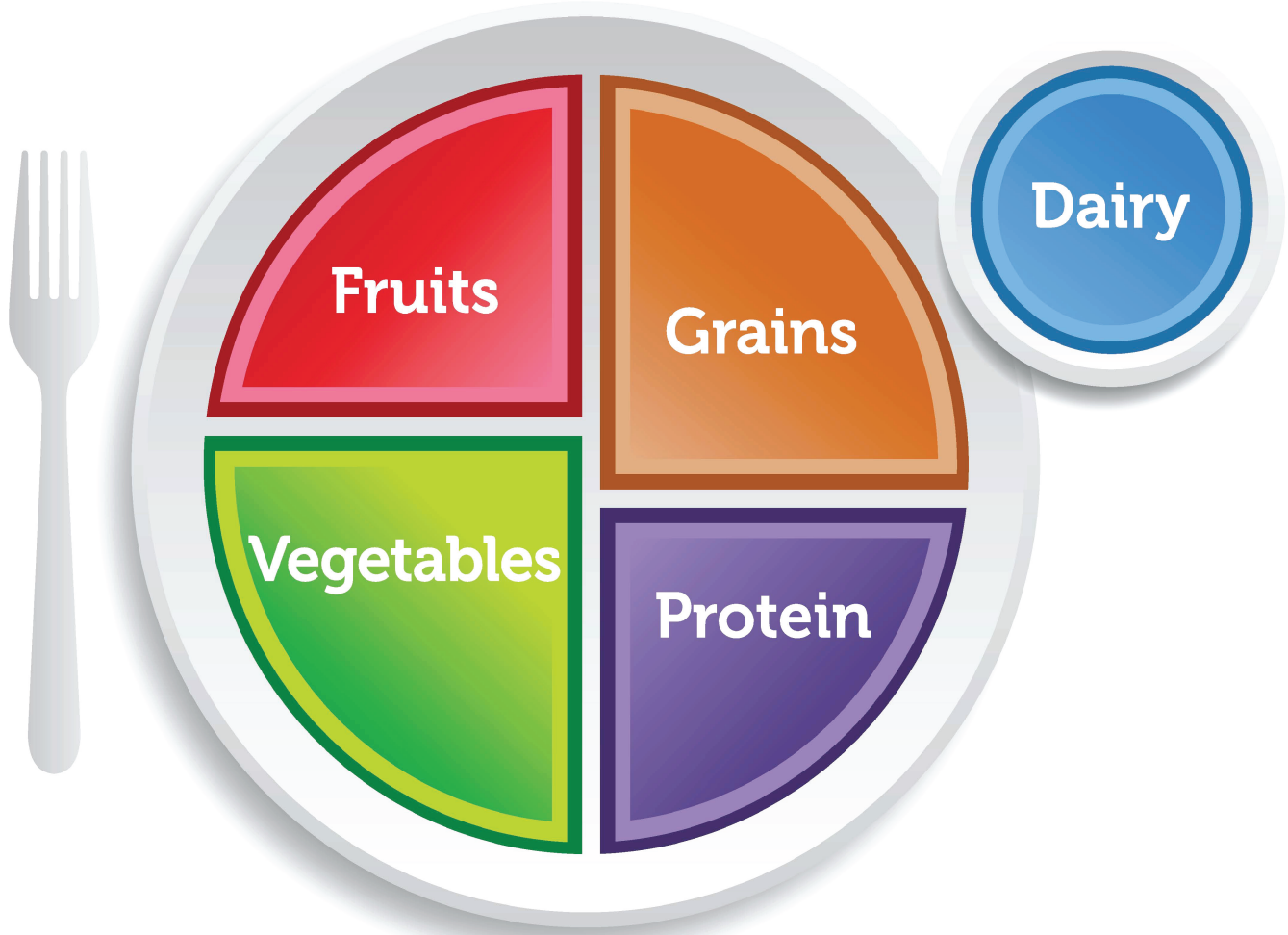

Utah and U.S. Agricultural Facts

Utah exports alfalfa cubes, hay, live cattle, beef, cowhides, turkeys, cheese, cookies, onions, UHT milk (which doesn't require refrigeration), lamb, apples, tart cherries, and other agricultural products.

The average size of a Utah farm/ranch is 587 acres, with assets of \$2.4 billion. There are approximately 18,409 farms/ranches in Utah.

The United States grows about 34% of the world's soybeans and about 36% of the world's supply of corn.

Livestock products sales (meat, milk, and eggs) account for 69% of Utah's agricultural income.

20% of Utah's land is in farms, but less than 16% of that farmland is cropland.

Utah ranks 37th in the U.S. in terms of cash receipts from agricultural commodities.

Farmers and ranchers make up less than 2% of the U.S. population; in 1920 it was 30%. When the Constitution was signed, it was 90%; when the Pilgrims came, every family produced its own food.

Utah agricultural production and processing accounts for 15% of the economy in the state of Utah and provides jobs for approximately 79,500 people.
